Canadian Rockies Public Schools' Board Meeting Diges August 28, 2024

New Rules on Use of Personal Mobile Devices

At the Board of Trustees' August 28 meeting, Trustees learned of three Administrative Procedures (AP) that were updated to align with Alberta Education's Ministerial Order, "Standards for the Use of Personal Mobile Devices and Social Media in Schools." Slight changes were made to AP 140 Technology Acceptable Use, AP 145 Use of Personal Mobile Devices, and AP 146 Use of Social Media. Effective Aug. 26, 2024, all students must silence or power off their devices during instructional time and keep them out of sight. This applies to Kindergarten to Gr. 8 students throughout the school day and to Gr. 9 to 12 students during class and spare periods, with allowances before school, at lunch, and after school. Exceptions exist for health needs, specialized learning support, or teacher-approved activities. Additionally, social media access on CRPS networks is now blocked to minimize distractions. These changes aim to foster a more focused learning environment, with each school tailoring specific rules to fit their unique settings under the updated administrative procedures.

Summer CALM Thrives with Strong Participation

Canadian Rockies Public Schools (CRPS) celebrated a successful run of its Summer CALM programs this year, offering nine weeks of dynamic learning opportunities. With 11 separate sessions, the program saw an impressive 430 students from across Alberta complete the course, guided by a dedicated team of 20 teachers and two assistants. Each week, three teachers and an assistant worked collaboratively to create an engaging and supportive learning environment. The summer program combined classroom learning with outdoor experiences, enriching students' understanding of career and life management, while promoting leadership skills. This hands-on approach, supported by enthusiastic educators, not only kept students engaged during the summer break but also ensured they were equipped with essential skills for their educational journey ahead.
